## Farmers Markets now accepting food stamps

Nevada residents who are strapped for cash now have a better option for purchasing fresh, locally-grown produce.

The Las Vegas Farmers Market (with locations at Gardens Park, Bruce Trent Park and Floyd Lamb Park at Tule Springs) has recently installed EBT machines to be used to process payments for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program payments (or SNAP, formerly known as food stamps).

It is currently the only farmers' market in the state of Nevada that accepts SNAP benefits. "It's really wonderful for the community," says Ginger Johnson, who, with her

husband Steve, opened the Las Vegas Farmers Market over a decade ago. "Many people come up and say, 'Oh, I wouldn't have been able to have a meal' and it's really cost-effective for them too. They are so thrilled that we have it. Thrilled!"

Only 1,500 of the nation's roughly 7,100 farmers' markets are set up to use the Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) system. Last month, Deputy Secretary of Agriculture, Kathleen Merrigan, announced that the USDA will provide \$4 million in

grants to help expand availability of the EBT system at farmers' markets not currently accepting SNAP benefits. "This funding will help SNAP customers increase their opportunities to access healthy, local foods," said Deputy Secretary Merrigan

in a statement, "and evidence suggests they will take advantage of that access. When we couple this approach with strategies like the education, cooking demonstrations and community support often found at farmers' markets, consumption of healthy foods should rise even more."

The funding will be distributed using an allocation formula, weighted toward states that have a large number of farmers' markets without SNAP capacity. The state of Nevada has 36 farmers' markets and has been allocated \$27,794 or 0.69 percent of the grant.

Of the \$4 million grant, Merrigan said in a press conference that although it is not a huge amount of "Market" continued on page 2

## Local coach arrested for sexual assault

"I loved the boy victim-- would never hurt him."

These were the horrific, not to mention, IRONIC, words of Marvin Juarez, 35, who was arrested Sunday on four counts of sexual assault with a victim under 14, one count of unlawful contact with a child and 11 counts of lewdness with a minor under 14, according to an arrest report released Tuesday.

According to the report, a 13-year-old boy told his mother that Juarez, his soccer coach for Atletico Club Las Vegas, sexually assaulted him Saturday after practice.

The victim told detectives the first sexual assault occurred Thursday after practice at Juarez's apartment, 1550 E. Harmon Ave.

Afterward, the boy told police, Juarez bought him fast food.

The victim said nearly identical sexual assaults happened Saturday after Juarez bought

him soccer equipment.

Police located Juarez Sunday and transported him for questioning to Metro's head-

money, it can do huge things. “We saw that in fiscal year 2008 we had redemption of \$1.5 million in SNAP at farmers’ markets. Fast forward to fiscal year 2011, that’s \$8 mil-

lion. So in that time period, it was a 400-percent increase. If we get more farmers’ markets online with this capacity, who knows what that number might be next year?”

Sharon Murphy has been a vendor at the Las Vegas Farmers Market Bruce Trent Park location for the past two years. She says that although some people may not be used to the idea of going to a farmers’ market to utilize their SNAP benefits, the word is spreading and she has seen an increase in SNAP/EBT sales. “It’s a good opportunity for people to get fresh produce

and for many to buy fresh-baked breads where they can’t get them at the store,” says Murphy, who sells a variety of healthy breads as well as delicious baked goods at the market. “People are really excited when they realize that they can actually purchase breads along with the produce.”

With increased funding available from the government, will we see this program spread throughout other farmers’ markets across Nevada?

“I think eventually you will see them,” says Stella Guevara, SNAP program director for the Las Vegas Farmers Market. “But again, we’re the first ones sort of pioneering the program, so of course we have to develop everything from policies to procedures, to working with the USDA as well as the health department to figure out how it would work.”

quarters, where he claimed he was also a victim of sexual abuse as a child in El Salvador.

Investigators suspect there may be other victims in the Las Vegas area, Metro spokesman Bill Cassell said. Juarez coached soccer in a primarily Hispanic community for teams with boys

12 to 15 years old, he said. “This guy had access to children,” said Cassell. “He had a victim pool for between one and two years.” Police are encouraging any other victims to come forward, regardless of immigration status. “The situation,” added Cassell,” also underscores

Juvenile Justice in Nevada

Key people inside the Nevada Juvenile Justice Department are apparently considering recommending major changes in procedure to the Nevada Legislature. This has been reported at least twice by television station KSNV, channel 3. I have tried to research the details, and the specifics have been

hard to locate.

As it stands now, it is my understanding that in Nevada, juveniles aged eight and older can be tried as adults for extremely serious crimes like murder, rape and a few others.

These juveniles can then be sentenced as adults and perhaps be sent to prison with adult inmates.

They are looking at two changes. The first would be to send juveniles to their own detention center and not send them to prison with older adults.

The second change is that at a certain age, like 18 or 19, their sentence would be terminated and they would be given a clean slate to start over.

The first change, sending juveniles to their own facility as opposed to mixing them in with adult

criminals, is a good goal and should receive wide support.

The second change, wiping the slate clean after a certain age is obtained, is not good. If a juvenile is tried and found guilty of a serious crime and sentenced as an adult, he/she should fulfill the entire sentence.

When the age of majority is obtained, the individual should be transferred to an adult prison rather than just being set free. We have a significant problem with juvenile crime in Nevada as it is. We do not need to open the floodgates and establish policies that further weaken what is already relatively weak. Nevada citizens will need to watch this issue carefully and let their legislators know just where they stand on this issue.

have been removed from their support network and brought to a foreign land, they are psychologically and physically controlled through threats and abuse.

Children, often without caretakers, are simply bought and sold like commodities, unable to fight back against their oppressors. Men can be forced into labor through financial debt or the threat of violence against themselves or those closest to them.

No matter how they are compelled to submit to the trafficker’s will, these human beings are transformed into another person’s property.

There is no way to know precisely how many people are currently enslaved by human traffickers. Estimates range from 10 to 30 million, but no exact number can be generated due to the underground nature of the industry. According to Kathleen Ja Sook Bergquist, Ph.D., Esq. of the organiza-

tion Bamboo Bridges, 14 to 17 thousand slaves are trafficked into the United States annually. Over 70 percent of these are women, and roughly 20 percent are children. Many of these women and children are brought to Las Vegas, one of the top 17 destination cities for slaves.

Once these exploited peoples have been taken to their destinations, they are forced to perform a variety of tasks against their will. Slaves that are brought to American cities such as Las Vegas are often entered into the sex industry.

Underaged girls and women alike are brought to stores that put up false fronts; these establishments advertise themselves to be massage parlors or reflexology clinics, but behind closed doors, they are brothels staffed by slaves.

Legitimate businesses suffer from the reputation generated by these centers of human exploitation, but identifying a place that is using enslaved sex work-

ers is not difficult from a consumer standpoint.

The warning signs include odd hours of operation, unsanitary conditions, underdressed and/or underaged employees, and beds in place of massage tables.

These establishments often have precautions in place to prevent law enforcement agencies from rooting them out, and it is up to the public

to report suspicious activity.

While sexual slavery is one of the most common reasons for human trafficking, it is not the only one.

In other parts of the world, slaves are used to perform manual as well as sexual labor. Chocolate, coffee, jade, diamonds and countless other resources are produced or obtained through the exploitation of enslaved laborers according to the U.S. Department of Labor’s

14-17 thousand slaves are trafficked in the U.S. annually. Many of these slaves are brought to Las Vegas, one of the top 17 destinations.

list of goods produced by child labor or slavery.

In the globalized economy, it falls to the consumer to ensure that the goods they purchase are ethically traded. Slavery is driven by the same supply and demand system that governs all other goods and services.

To choke out human trafficking, one must start at its root: money. Every individual

let the consumer know that human suffering was not involved in their production.

In order to rely less on individual and corporate accountability, the local and federal governments are working on legislative solutions to protect those vulnerable to human trafficking.

At the national level, multiple federal agencies including but not limited to, The Department of Health and Human Services, The Department of Homeland Security and the Department of Labor are all working together to create laws and regulations that deter human traffickers and aide in their prosecution once they have been identified.

In the city of Las Vegas, the Southern Nevada Health Department has been working hand in hand with legitimate businesses and anti-trafficking activists in order to create laws that provide more health and safety for everyone.

Human trafficking is a global problem, and the so-

lution must also be global in scope. Slavery will not disappear overnight, and it will never be entirely eradicated unless everyone steps up and does what they can to prevent the exploitation of vulnerable, impoverished people.

Awareness is the first step; by knowing the warning signs of human trafficking activity, the public can better report suspicious occurrences to the law enforcement agencies in place to stop them. The second step is the responsibility of both individuals and corporations.

To cut off the flow of money to human traffickers, companies must carefully source their products, and consumers must refuse to buy products that have not taken steps to protect their fellow man.

These things in combination with supporting anti-trafficking regulation and law enforcement at the local and federal level will help bring about an end to modern slavery.

## Stop trashing the desert

A gust of wind swirled the desert dust into a mini-tornado on a lake bed as I drove past Joshua trees in the interior of the Mojave. Wisps of cloud hung low in the distant horizon. A red-tailed hawk circled around a hill. I was enthralled by the immense space and tranquility, but my joy soon subsided when I saw old tires, broken chairs, jars, rusty soda cans, plastic bags strewn around and rags entangled in creosote bushes. I was squarely reminded that I was not too far from humans.

The Mojave Desert, one of the smallest deserts in the world, has been the most cherished natural area of the Southwest. Despite the harsh environmental conditions, it teems with desert flora and fauna, many of which are highly endangered. Some of the prominent species are the

coyote, desert fox, bighorn sheep, golden eagle, desert tortoise and jack rabbit, yet their habitats are increasingly being degraded due to illegal dumping of trash. People load their trucks with discarded household items and dump them indiscriminately in the desert, which not only spoils the scenic beauty but also harms desert plants and animals.

Broken glasses can lacerate the feet of mammals like foxes and coyotes that roam the desert landscape. Small lizards can squeeze into bottles or cans to seek protection or search for food, but often find it difficult to get out and die of overheating. Toxic metals can adversely affect the cellular processes such as photosynthesis of many plants that have horizontal root systems just below the surface. High levels of toxic metals like lead and mer-

curry are increasingly being reported in the tissues of wild animals like desert tortoises. Large predators like coyotes generally suffer more from metal toxicity due to bioaccumulation.

Some people consider the desert a desiccated, barren land that in essence is useless wasteland. They should realize that the Mojave Desert provided ecosystem services to people for thousands of years, and continues to do so. Plants like mesquite, pinyon pine and oak have been crucial for the survival of Native Americans in the Mojave. In addition, there are innumerable water-stingy plants that have medicinal properties. For instance, creosote, an evergreen bush commonly found in the Mojave, is known to cure several gastrointestinal

and respiratory ailments. There are probably scores of plants whose medicinal properties are yet to be discovered; antidotes for debilitating diseases with hitherto no cure might be hidden in the desert.

Given these, destroying the Mojave Desert would be

killing the goose that laid the golden eggs. We need to do all we can to conserve it for ourselves and for posterity. By restraining ourselves from trashing the desert, we will be sparing the lives of thousands of

plants and animals that may be a unique genetic reservoir for our future food and medicine. Many things, like aluminum cans and plastic containers, that people cast away in the desert do not readily disintegrate and thus remain a threat to wild flora and fauna for decades.

To maintain the integrity of the desert ecosystem, people also need to manage the garbage dumps in towns. Research worldwide has shown that populations of several predators get artificially inflated as a result of them feeding on these dumps. This has adverse effects on natural ecosystems: High numbers of these predators drive their natural prey to extinction. Studies in the Mojave have reported ravens threatening several endangered species, including the desert tortoise.

# Electric Daisy Carnival Las Vegas 2.0

Having been in the electronic music scene since the late nineties, writing about this event is not something that will be much of a stretch for me. The anticipation on the web and the streets that this year's Electric Daisy Carnival in Las Vegas will be bigger than previous years doesn't even come close to covering it. Last year, they planted a flag in the desert, but this year they will be launching the entire vibe of the party into outer space.

Stepping back into the past a bit, the biggest blow the rave scene has ever taken was when government legislation, championed by none other than our current Vice President,

Joe Biden, legally marked a rave as a crack den and any promoter responsible for the event was deemed a purveyor of such and could be prosecuted accordingly. The only person ever publicly tried under this statute was Disco Donnie, documented in the movie Rise, and he in fact won the case, but the underground rave scene had undergone too much stress from local law enforcement agencies in the process that eventually brought the scene itself to a screeching halt. People were actually imprisoned based on the same principles in the United Kingdom.

The Electric Daisy Carnival stands as the last bastion of what we as an electronic music culture can truly refer to as a 'rave.' Although the production is way beyond the scope

of anything that an underground warehouse party in years gone by could have hoped to accomplish, the incarnation in Vegas is a dusk till dawn dance party with a unifying vibe. Pasquale Rotella, founder and president of Insomniac (the production company that puts on Electric Daisy Carnival) has claimed through Twitter that "all of these issues are being fully addressed."

Aside from the event itself, the main thing making this Electric Daisy Carnival more massive than the last one in Vegas or any of the previous California occurrences is the addition of EDC Week in Las Vegas. This will feature countless club performances from international electronic music artists and the EDMBiz conference at the Cosmopolitan. This puts EDC Vegas on par with the Winter Music Conference and Ultra Music Festival in Miami that happen annually every March, and after this year, most likely on a higher stake on the totem pole for electronic music fans due to the unbelievable commercialization of Ultra Music Festival. In the words of the greatest DJ of all time, Tiësto, as crowned by the readers of Mixmag (the most respected electronic music magazine on the planet), "Electric Daisy Carnival in Las Vegas is the biggest production in the United States, and the fans just go wild."

# Fifty Shades of Grey Book Review

On Mother's day, my fiance and I traveled to my grandfather's friends' house to celebrate. The women there, ranging in age from fifty-five to seventy, were all abuzz, talking about a book I had never heard of. My ears perked up, "Oh, what book?" I asked, trying to hide my excitement since in this day and age it is so rare to hear anyone raving about a book. "Fifty Shades of Grey," they all responded. They were all reading it. Now, I left under the mistaken impression that this was a tween book that was deemed too raunchy for young readers.

When I went to research the book, I was scandalized. It has been very hard to shake the image of anyone, much less my grandfather's septuagenarian friends, cozing up with this book. "Fifty Shades of Grey" has rapidly become the New York Times #1 Best Erotic Seller. The book, written by E. L. James, has sold over ten million copies. E.L. James (Erika Leonard, for any of those interested) began her writing career

largely made up of married women over thirty. Hence the moniker bestowed upon it by various media agencies: "mommy porn." 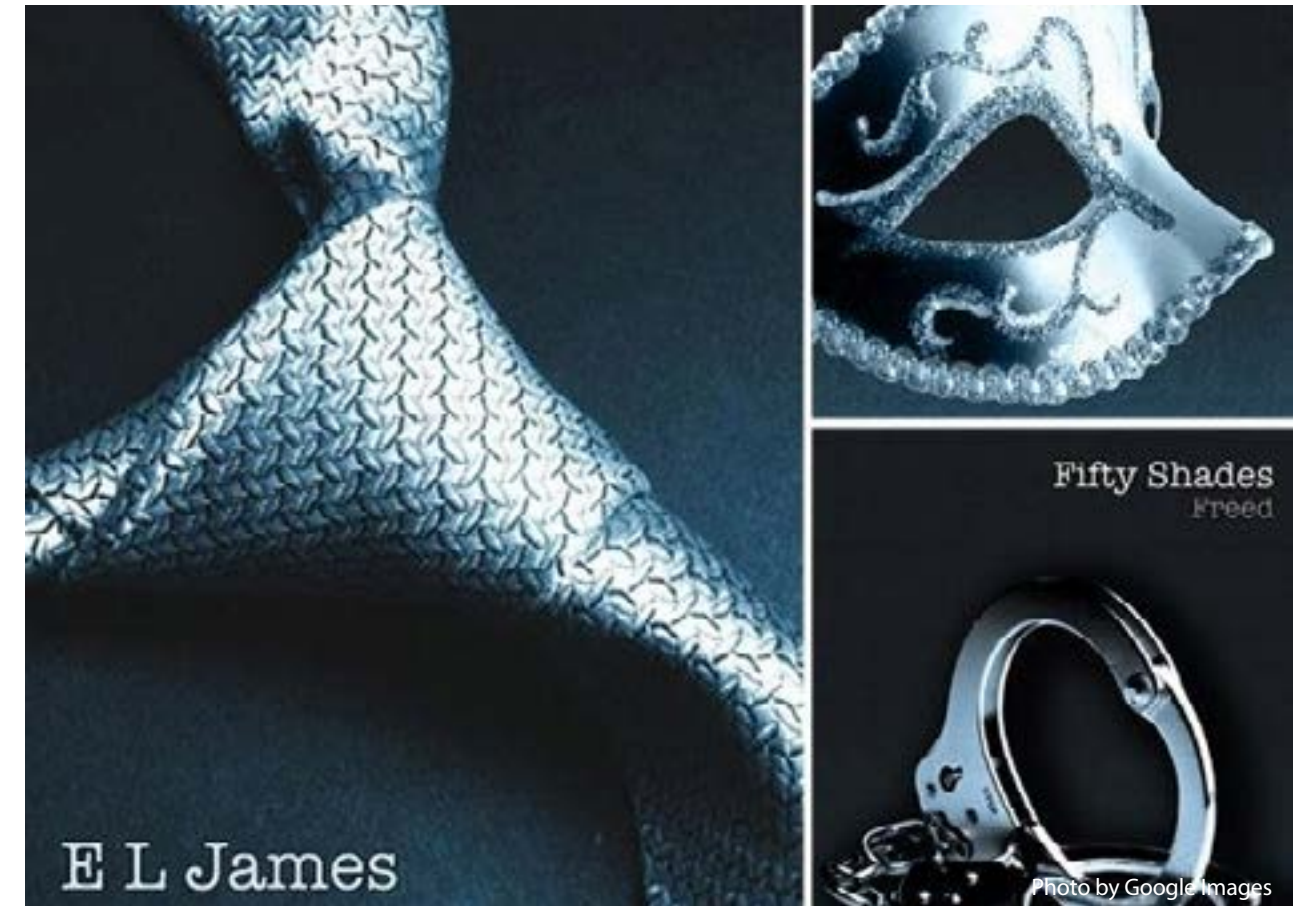
On the other hand, I do not champion this work in the least. The book is poorly written smut, which I know has been the sentiment through time memorial of the townsfolk

Really, James was at her best here as that would have made an apt title.

Not only were they losing the Giants but they were also losing National League baseball in New York. That was

IMPOSSIBLE, but true.

For five long years, the Giant/National League fan in New York suffered. The young man never, ever again rooted for the Giants. The only exception he made was pulling for Willie Mays. Willie never wanted to leave New York. He was as much a part of New York as the two cents plain. The pictures you see

of him playing stickball in the streets with the New York kids is not just hype. That was Willie. The best baseball player that ever lived.

Finally... 1962. Robert Shea spearheads a drive to bring a new National League team into New York. They will be called the “Metropolitans.” The

“Mets” to you. They would start playing in the old Polo Grounds as they await the building of a new stadium in Queens, which would eventually be known as ‘Shea’ Stadium. Casey Stengel would be its first manager, and the roster would be made up of every star player they could find who was well past his prime. Players like

Roger Craig, Gil Hodges, Richie Ashburn, Frank Thomas and many others. They struggled. Oh, how they struggled. And the young man struggled with them. Of course, he wasn't quite as young now, but he retained for the Mets every bit of the enthusiasm he had had with the Giants. He knew what they were

facing for the next few years, but he also knew that it would change. Then, suddenly, it was 1969.

In 1968, the Mets had finished dead last but had brought up a young pitcher named Tom Seaver. In 1969, with Seaver leading the way, the Mets, slowly but surely, found that yes, they WERE this good. They COULD play and win against the best the National League could throw against them. The Amazin' Mets won the pennant AND went on to beat the Baltimore Orioles in the World Series. The (not so) young man was ecstatic. The Mets had ups and downs for years after that. Their high point was obviously in 1986 when they defeated the Boston Red Sox in the World Series.

One thing (though not nearly as important as the wins) still eluded the Mets. As of June 1, 2012, a Met pitcher had never thrown a no-hitter. They were in the 51st year of their existence. They had

played 8,019 games, and had NEVER had a pitcher throw a no-hitter. Close a few times, but no marbles. Enter Johan Santana. Citi Field; June 1, 2012. The great, veteran left-hander, coming back from a very serious shoulder operation, took his no-no into the eighth inning against the St. Louis Cardinals. Due to the injury, Manager Terry Collins had set Johan's maximum pitch count at around 112. The most pitches he had EVER thrown in a game was 125. Collins asked him how he felt. He said: “Fine, I'm not coming out.” He got through the eighth inning. Again, before entering the ninth. “How do you feel?” “I'm not coming out.” The rest is history. He threw 134 pitches. A Met pitcher had thrown the FIRST no-hitter in Met history. The old man was beside himself. He actually had tears in his eyes. It was sort of like a culmination of his love affair with baseball.

The Thunder defense held Parker to twelve points in the 4th game. This is Parker's team now, no longer Duncan's. If the Thunder can bottle up Parker, I think that's all she wrote.
