

Terminal 3 ready for take-off

Fewer than two weeks remain, and the impressive 1.9 million square foot Terminal Three at McCarran International Airport will be open for business.

The \$2.4 billion terminal boasts seven international gates, seven domestic gates, 32 curbside check-in systems, 130 inside the lobby and nearly 6,000 parking spaces spanning over eight levels. Flight operations begin June 27th, and with strong congestion at Terminal One, the opening couldn't come at a better time.

"Terminal Three's opening will relieve congestion during peak periods at Terminal One, whether that congestion occurs on the roadways, curbsides, the ticketing lobby or security checkpoints," says Chris Jones, Public Affairs &

Marketing Manager for Mc- large volume of travelers." Carran. "Currently, more than 90 percent of McCarran's passengers go through Terminal One. With T3, we will be able to balance out those peaks thanks to the flexibility of having two terminals, each capable of handling a

Laughlin denied incorporation

proposal for Laughlin, Nev. to become incorporated was defeated at the polls this week. Residents of this tourist town decided on the measure on June 12th, and voters in opposition prevailed over the ones in support of it. The final score showed 962 votes against incorporation and only 729 in favor. At day's end, ballots cast totaled 1691, a number that represented a turnout of sixty percent of the 2,700 registered voters in town.

Those in the losing minority still managed to get 43 percent of the vote, a figure that will likely encourage them to try again in the future. Cityhood for Laughlin was a heated issue leading up to the voting this week, with

both sides fervently arguing for and against it. Proponents of the measure claimed that Clark County Government Centers, located in downtown Las Vegas, are just too far and out of reach for the reality of daily life in Laughlin.

For example, under the current status, a resident of Laughlin who needs a building permit has to make the nearly two-hour, 100-mile long drive to Las Vegas. The same rings true if a meeting

with an elected official is in order, because bureaucrats operate from the central outposts located in Las Vegas.

On the other hand, opponents feared that if Laughlin became an incorporated entity, it would not have sufficient resources to pay the bills and exist on its own. They argued that in case of failure, the State would take over the town's finances and a raise in property taxes would

A water cycle similar to Earth's could also be occurring on Titan with the methane. It could be evaporating from the tropical lake and then raining into the lakes toward the poles, where it is cool enough for the methane to stay in liquid form.

Laughlin is a true desert oasis, a small town of 7,000 people sitting in the Valley of the Colorado River. The resort town boasts an impressive 2.3 million visitors per year, and it hosts big annual events such as the Laughlin Regatta and the Laughlin River Run, a motorcycle enthusiasts' gathering. It has its own international airport, golf courses, gambling and dining amenities, shows, and miles of river for sports and fun on the water. According to the local Chamber of Commerce, close to six percent of the gaming revenue Clark County receives is generated there

The town prides itself in being a cheaper alternative to Las Vegas; Laughlin is a destination where visitors still gamble, or enjoy a good dinner and show on a low budget. However, not everything in Laughlin is about casinos and gaming. This enclave in the Mohave also offers opportunities to explore wildlife, like hiking and bird watching. In addition, there are nearby attractions such as famous Route 66, or the old west town of Oatman, in bordering Arizona.

Perhaps being remote and removed from a big metropolis like Las Vegas is not a bad thing. Residents here treasure the clean, crisp air that lets them enjoy a blue sky during the day and the opportunity to gaze at the stars at night. Maybe the residents here like it that way, and the long trips for official business come with the living

Delegates head to Tampa to sue GOP to join the lawsuit which would bring the total to 160 Delegates.

Over 120 Delegates to the Republican National Convention are suing the GOP to be free from voting for Romney on the first ballot for Presidential Nominee and are arguing that they have been illegally coerced into choosing Mitt Romney for the party's presidential nominee and demanding they be "unbound" to vote for another candidate

this week in U.S. District Court in California demands the delegates be freed to "vote their conscience" for presidential nominee at the party's August national convention in Tampa, Fla., rather than being "bound" to vote for a certain candidate, as many state party bylaws require, based on the primary elections and other delegate selection procedures. The delegates claim the party violated federal law by forcing them to sign loyalty affidavits, under threat of perjury, to vote for Mitt Romney, though he is not yet the official nominee. "They don't want to be

bound to any candidate, or even be forced to vote for the nominee," Richard Gilbert, of Gilbert & Marlowe, attorney for the delegates, told Courthouse News. "To have a real convention, the delegates must have free will so that when they meet, they can persuade each other and then decide who

to vote for." The courts have typically allowed political parties leeway in the nomination of their candidates, but this case asks the court to consider the choice of presidential nominee a "federal election," subject to laws that would free delegates from party procedures to vote their conscience. Beyond merely asserting delegates' "right" to vote

their conscience, however, the lawsuit asserts the GOP has engaged in a racketeering-like scheme to push Romney as the candidate. "The Republican National

charges Republican officials and operatives have used threats of violence, certified unlawful slates of delegates, demanded affidavits of loyalty to Romney under penalty of perjury and have even altered ballot results to make sure the national convention is stacked with delegates who will vote for Romney



A "what if" scenario: No public parks, libraries, schools or hospitals

Sure these things are great. But they cost money, and it is taxpayers' money. Who can say that the private sector wouldn't provide these services better and cheaper? Maybe the money should be spent on better alternatives. The government is notoriously wasteful. Maybe even more services could be provided if they were provided by the private sector instead of the government sector.

You may think that this idea is not feasible, but consider that the country, the states, the counties and the cities are in financial difficulty and seeking to raise revenue by raising taxes. How much higher can they raise taxes? When they cannot raise taxes, how will they pay for these services? As expenses exceed revenue, these services will be reduced, provided for a fee or even eliminated. Rather than paying the government more for less, why not give the private sector a chance without government interference?

If the government provided a tax-free status to the companies that provide these services, many companies would be encouraged to offer them. Competition would keep the prices affordable and the quality high.

Consider that the government taxes us and then decides what services they think would be best for us. Then the government spends this tax money to provide these services in an inefficient manner.

Look at education. The private schools provide a better education at a lower cost per student than the public schools. The government could use a voucher system and save money.

Private companies could buy the existing schools and thereby provide revenue to the government.

Consider the public parks. We already have private parks in many private communities. Many public parks charge a fee to use. Could the private sector do it better and cheaper?

The private sector is already providing books and videos electronically. It is very possible the public library could be replaced by an electronic library in the future, making it very sensible for the private sector to provide this service.

Instead of taking money by force and coercing people to pay for services that they do not need or use, maybe it would be better to have the private sector provide these services. The people who need these services would pay for them, and they would be able to have a voice in the service. If the company didn't provide the quality or type of service that they wanted, they could go to a different





Weekly Recipe Banana Bread

This banana bread is a huge hit in my house. The secret is the cinnamon sugar crust and the small amount of sour cream for that moist interior. Sour cream may seem like an odd ingredient to add, but it puts this banana bread over the top. Whether you eat it plain or warm with a little butter, this banana bread is a delicious comfort-food treat. These loaves are great for gift giving if you can keep vour household off of them long enough to wrap!

Makes: 2 loaves in 9" x 4" pans. Different sized pans will need different baking times.

1/4 cup white sugar mixed with 1 tsp cinnamon to coat

- 1 tbs butter to grease pans
- 2 tbs honey
- 2 and 3/4 cups white sugar
- 3/4 cups butter
- 3 eggs
- 9 mashed bananas
- 1 cup sour cream
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp salt 3 tsp baking soda
- 4 1/2 cups all purpose flour

- 1. Preheat the oven to 300 degrees Fahrenheit. Coat two loaf pans with butter and cinnamon sugar and set aside.
- 2. Mash bananas and mix with cinnamon, vanilla extract, eggs, and sour cream.
- 3. Cream together sugar, butter and honey in a large
- 4. Add the banana mixture to the sugar mixture and
- 5. Mix salt, baking soda and flour. Slowly add to the banana mixture until all the flour is integrated.
- 6. Pour half of the mix into each pan and place in the
- 7. All ovens vary, so start with a 60 minute timer. After that, check the bread at least every twenty minutes, rotating the pans as necessary to cause even browning. It's done when a tooth pick can slide cleanly in and out of the
- 8. Use a knife to loosen the bread from the sides of the pan, and allow the loaves to cool on a cooling rack. Slice




